If parent doesn't have taxes for April done by Jan. 1, parent may use either estimated taxes or last year's taxes to start the process. Parent may also apply by phone at 1-800-433-3243. The information required is: social security # for student and parent, driver's license #, alien registration # (if not a US citizen), federal tax info or tax returns, including W-2 information for student and parents, records of untaxed income, info on savings, investments, and business and farm assets for student and parents.
